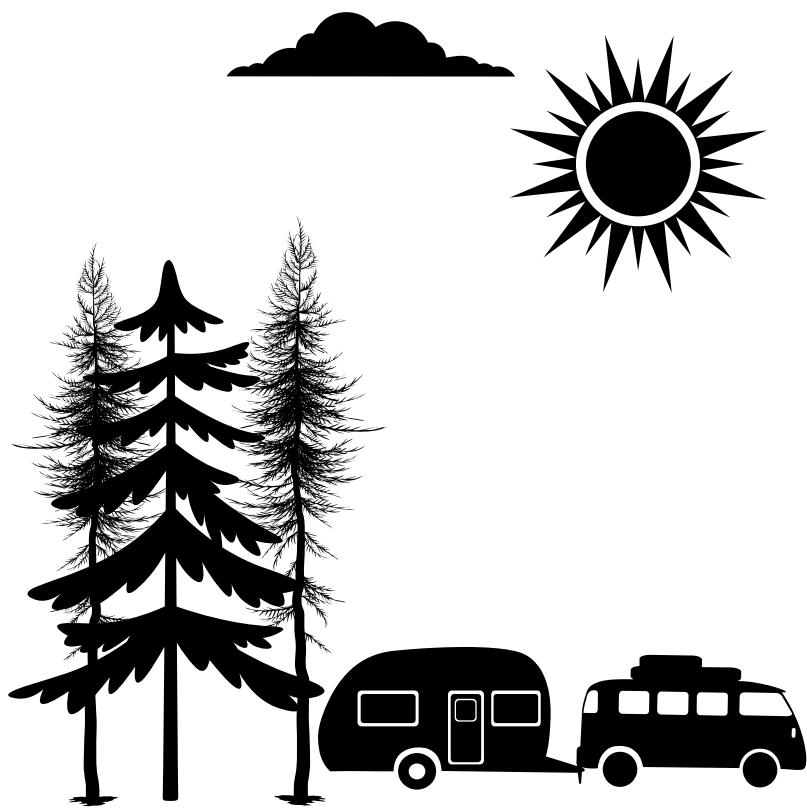




# Camping Info

# FAQS & More

- Is there parking?
  - Yes. The WKU Ag facility has plenty of parking.
- Can I camp?
  - Yes. There are RV camp sites available on site. Fires are NOT allowed and there are no picnic tables.
- Can I bring my dog?
  - No. The WKU facility does not allow pets.
  - Certified service dogs only are allowed but please be sure to clean up after your dog and they MUST be on a leash and in your control at all times.
- Can I bring my kids?
  - Absolutely! Kids 17 and under are free.
- The festival is an indoor, temperature regulated facility.
- Food and drinks will be available for purchase but you can bring your own as well.
- There are several stairs in the arena, but you can also access the arena from the outside.
- Cash is king with our vendors and some even like to barter. Give it a try!
